# TEAM MEETS WITH MUSEUM OF ETHNOLOGY

Our project lead, Lisa Jones, met with the Museum of Ethnology this week! The Hanoi based museum will support us in hosting a final policy event to showcase the work of the youth and will help us create a water puppetry performance that encapsulates the youths stories in a locally sensitive and create way. Water puppetry has been an old age and indigenous way of communicating stories in Vietnam since the 11th century, and so we are extremely happy to have them partnering with us!
